CHECK YOUR CLASSES Open the report and scroll down until you find your horse. All classes you are entered into are listed. To make any changes, adds, scratches please use the link on the website.

### FRIDAY HOURS

Haul in after 11am on Friday. Show Office opens 1pm & closes at the end of the show

ARENA Will be open to practice until 2pm. Trail schooling will be available at 2:30-3:30. At that time the arena will be closed to get ready for the start of the show

SHOW will begin at 4:00pm

SATURDAY Office Opens 7am & closes at end of show Show starts at 8am. Immediately following the show Ranch Trail will be set up. The arena will be left open for practice with room to ride around the course by staying on the rail.

SUNDAY Office Opens 7am & closes at end of show Show starts at 8am

When you arrive at the show check in at the office with a form of payment. Numbers are not released until a form of payment is received.

TRAIL Trail set up will take place at 2pm with practice to follow at 2:30 to 3:30. If you are entered in a trail class you will be charged a \$5 trail equipment fee. Trail warm up is for those that are entered in a trail class.

### **Pre-Entry Cut Off Date Monday 5/6/2024**

Entries will be accepted after the post entry date. You will simply pay the \$20 post entry fee. You can still haul in and enter at the show!

ADDS/SCRATCHES You can add and scratch at the show using the link at [www.horseshowpro.com/spring-opener](http://www.horseshowpro.com/spring-opener). There is no refund on scratched classes, this is a benefit show.

Patterns are posted on at [www.horseshowpro.com/spring-opener](http://www.horseshowpro.com/spring-opener). Patterns will be posted at the show. No hard copies will be available of the patterns or the class list. Be sure to print them before you leave for the show!

There will be a Show Steward onsite to answer any questions you might have about class criteria & eligibility.

If you reserved a stall, it will be open and ready for you on Friday by 11am. If you did not reserve a stall you can get one at the show when you arrive. Please come to the office if you need a stall but did not reserve one. The stall chart will be posted on fb & the website on Wednesday.

**PATTERN CLASSES** Pattern classes will have a draw / order of go. IE: trail, showmanship, equitation, horsemanship. Any class that go's "1 at a time" not to include halter.

#### CODE OF CONDUCT

Just be nice! If there is any problems, seek out management.

We expect each exhibitor, trainer & any supporting people of all participants to practice good sportsmanship

Be respectful. We won't all agree all the time, but disagreement is no excuse for disrespectful behavior. Choose your words carefully. Be kind to others. Do not insult or put down others. Harassment and belittling of another person will not be tolerated.

Don't harass. In general, if someone asks you to stop something, then stop. If you believe that person is incorrect in asking you to stop, please contact management

**ALWAYS** treat your show management, to include but not limited to show manager, secretaries, ring steward, in gate person & judge, with respect. Yelling, caustic remarks and/or sarcasm will not be tolerated.
